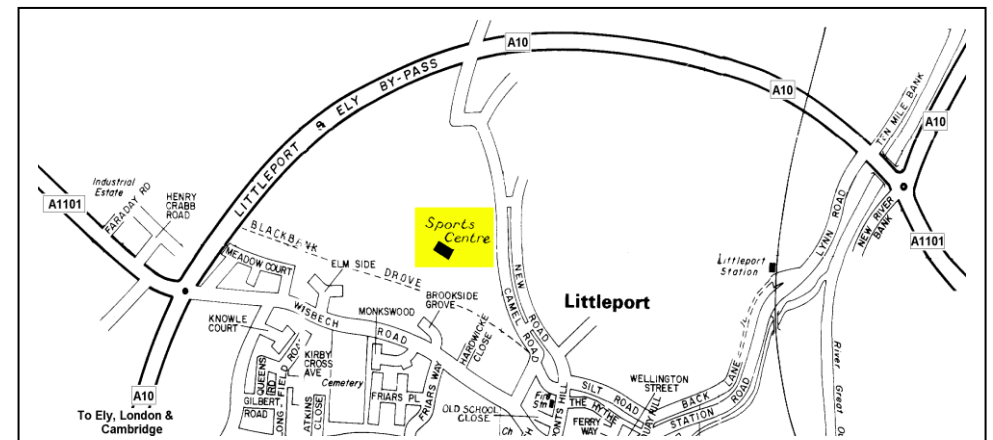

## RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. The show will open at 9.00 a.m.
2. Dogs will be received at any time but it is the exhibitor's responsibility to ensure that dogs are available for judging when required
3. Judging will commence at 10.00 a.m. prompt
4. Exhibits may be removed from the Show after their judging has been completed. The Show will close half an hour after all judging has been completed
5. The use of cooking stoves in the proximity of the tenting and benching areas is forbidden except as authorised by the show management
6. Entry fees: **Non-Members** First entry per dog £5.50, £1.50 each subsequent entry **Members** First entry per dog £4.50, £1.50p each subsequent entry; Not for Competition £1.50 per Dog. Catalogues £2.50 prepaid ONLY. Membership £3.00 Joint, £2.00 Single, £4.00 family (due 1st January)
7. PRIZE MONEY BIS, RBIS, BPIS - Souvenir RBPIS £5. All stakes classes £5
8. The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries..
9. Puppies under six calendar months of age on the first day of the show are not eligible for exhibition
10. The mating of bitches within the precincts of the show is forbidden
11. Best Puppy in Show Where a Best Puppy in Show competition is scheduled, the Best Puppy in Show is a puppy which has competed and is unbeaten by any other puppy exhibited at the same Show. A puppy is a dog of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show. Where the Best of Breed or Best in Show is a puppy it will also automatically be Best Puppy in Breed or Best Puppy in Show respectively. Similarly, if the Reserve Best of Breed or Reserve Best in Show is a puppy which has only been beaten by an adult dog it will also automatically be Best Puppy in Breed or Best Puppy in Show respectively. Consequently, selection of the Best Puppy in Breed and Best Puppy in Show must follow the selection of Best of Breed and Best in Show respectively. Best Puppy in Show must be selected from puppies which have been judged and are unbeaten by any other puppy.  
Withdrawal from other Competition Puppies which become eligible for Best Puppy in Show may be withdrawn from all other competition except Breed classes and Best Puppy in Breed prior to the competition for Best Puppy in Show in order to remain unbeaten. A puppy beaten in competition for Best Puppy in Show may subsequently be exhibited in all competition for which it was previously eligible. The dog declared Best Puppy in Show, however, must not compete in any subsequent competition. Puppies may be withdrawn from Any Variety Classes when judged before Breed Classes.  
Proviso For the purpose of this regulation, dogs beaten in competition for Stud Dog, Brood Bitch, Progeny, Brace and Team or a Special Award confined to one breed will not be considered to be beaten dogs.
12. Best in Show The dog declared Best in Show is a dog which has competed and is unbeaten by any other dog exhibited at the same Show. Best in Show must be selected from all unbeaten winning dogs. Reserve Best in Show must be selected from the remaining unbeaten winning dogs following the selection of Best in Show.  
Withdrawal from other Competition Dogs, which become eligible for Best in Show may be withdrawn from all other competition other than the Breed classes and Best of Breed prior to the competition for Best in Show as appropriate in order to remain unbeaten. A dog beaten in competition for Best in Show may subsequently be exhibited in all competition for which it was previously eligible. The dogs declared Best in Show and Reserve Best in Show, however, must not compete in any subsequent competition. Dogs may be withdrawn from Any Variety Classes when judged before Breed Classes  
Proviso For the purpose of this regulation, dogs beaten in competition for Stud Dog, Brood Bitch, Progeny, Brace and Team or a Special Award confined to one breed will not be considered to be beaten dogs.
13. Exhibits will not be admitted to best in Show competition after a period of ten minutes has elapsed since the announcement that exhibits are required for judging, unless they have been unavoidably delayed by previous judging not being completed on time, and then only with permission of the Show Management
14. No modifications will be made to this schedule except by permission of the General Committee of the Kennel Club, which will be followed by advertisement in the Canine Press wherever possible
15. All exhibitors must be familiar with the Kennel Club Regulation F (Annex B - Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition)
16. All dogs resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.

## 17. **DOGS IN CARS**

Your dog is vulnerable and at risk during hot weather and the Kennel Club offers the following guidance to help guide you through the do's and don'ts travelling to and whilst at KC licensed events.

- When travelling to a show please take a moment to consider whether the route to the show is on a busy holiday route, and leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic jams.
- If your vehicle is not air-conditioned seriously consider whether travelling to the show is a good idea at all.
- The vehicle should be as fully ventilated as possible, and plenty of stops should be taken, with lots of water available to drink.
- Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of free flowing air around the dog.
- When at the show, never leave your dog in the vehicle.
- Keep the dog in the shade – take your own shade for example a large umbrella and always have plenty of water available to drink so your dog stays well hydrated.
- Avoid your dog taking part in unnecessary exertion, or from standing in exposed sunlight for extended lengths of time. Remember, if you feel hot your dog is very likely to feel much hotter and dehydrated, and this could lead to dire results. Please look after your dog's welfare.

**Please take care of your dog.**

### **If your dog is found to be at risk forcible entry to your vehicle may be necessary without liability for any damage caused.**

Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. Breach of Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rules and Regulations.

Right to Refuse Entries. Exhibitors/Competitors are reminded that show societies have the right under Kennel Club Regulation to refuse any entry.

18. Not for competition entries will be accepted. Details of each dog so entered must be recorded on the entry form and must be Kennel Club Registered
19. The Committee will be most anxious for the care and safety of all dogs entered and for property entrusted to them but it must be clearly understood that the Society will not be responsible for any loss or detention of or damage to a dog or dogs, boxes or other property, whether arising from accident or any other cause whatsoever or from any act or omission or themselves, their officers, servants or others and it is on this understanding only that entries will be received
20. The Committee reserve the right to appoint substitute judges should any Judge of Judges be prevented from fulfilling their engagement
21. If the services of the Veterinary Surgeon are required, the fees which may be incurred must be paid by the exhibitor or exhibitors concerned.
22. Any owner, competitor, handler or other person in charge of a dog is required to remove as soon as possible any fouling caused by their dog(s) at any Kennel Club Licensed show within the licensed venue and within the environs of that event including car and caravan parks and approaches
23. **DOGS IN CARS Remedial action** will be taken in the event of dogs left in cars being found in a distressed condition
24. The owner, exhibitor, handler or other person in charge of a dog at a Kennel Club Licensed event must at all times ensure that the dog is kept under proper control whilst at the licensed venue, including its environs, car and caravan parks and approaches.
25. A dog may be disqualified by the General Committee from any award, whether an objection has been lodged or not, if proved amongst other things to have been a) registered or recorded as having been bred by the scheduled judge, this shall not apply to a judge appointed in an emergency, b) exhibited without payment of appropriate entry fees
26. Every exhibitor shall ensure that whilst the dog is being exhibited, its handler shall display the correct ring number.

## **DEFINITIONS OF CLASSES N.B. The word 'DOG' includes both sexes.**

For the purposes of Kennel Club Show Regulations, the term Variety Class also applies to Stakes classes  
**ALL DOGS ENTERED IN STAKES CLASSES MUST HAVE BEEN ENTERED IN OTHER CLASSES WHERE APPLICABLE**

In the following definitions, a Challenge Certificate includes any Show award that counts towards the title Champion under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club.

Wins at Championship Shows in breed classes where Challenge Certificates are not on offer shall be counted as wins at Open Shows. In the case of a dog owned in partnership and entered in members' classes or competing for members' specials, each partner must at the time of entry be a member of the Society.

In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including the seventh day before the closing of entries shall be counted when entering for any class, i.e. 5th March 2012

Wins in Variety classes do not count for entry in Breed classes but when entering in Variety classes wins in both Breed and Variety classes must be counted. A first prize does not include a Special Prize of whatever value. A dog is not eligible for entry in Variety classes unless also entered and subsequently exhibited in a Breed Class, where such a class is provided for which it is eligible. Exemptions from this regulation are :-

(1) A puppy, unless a class for dogs under 12 months of age for which it is eligible is provided for the breed

(2) A dog in Any Variety Field Trial or Working Trial Class

(3) A dog in Any Variety Veteran Class

(4) A dog in Any Variety Champion Class at a Championship or Open Show

(5) As provided in Annex A to Kennel Club F Regulations

(6) A dog which is withdrawn from exhibition in breed classes as a result of the appointment of an emergency judge

If an exhibitor reports before the judging of a class or classes that a dog has been entered which is ineligible, the exhibitor may choose one of the following options:

(1) Withdrawal: The dog may be withdrawn from competition subject to the conditions of Regulations 9(j) and 20.

(2) Transfer (a) If a dog is ineligible for a class or classes as regards its breed, colour, sex, weight or height, the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the equivalent class or classes for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height or, in the event of there being no equivalent class, Minor Puppy and Puppy excepted, to the Open class for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height.

(b) For an exhibit I entered incorrectly in a Minor Puppy Class, Puppy Class or a Junior class, which is over age but under 12 calendar months of age, 18 calendar months of age or 24 calendar months of age respectively, the show secretary shall transfer the exhibit to the Puppy Class, the Junior Class or Yearling Class respectively for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height and in the event of there being no Puppy, Junior or Yearling Class to the Open Class for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height

(d) If an exhibit arrives late and misses a class, even if it is the only class in which the dog is entered, the dog may not be transferred to any other class.

**MINOR PUPPY**: For dogs of six and not exceeding nine calendar months of age on the first day of the show

**PUPPY**: For dogs of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the show

**JUNIOR**: For dogs of six and not exceeding eighteen calendar months of age on the first day of the show

**YEARLING**: For dogs of twelve and not exceeding twenty four calendar months of age on the first day of the show

**NOVICE**: For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or three or more First prizes at Open and Championship Shows (Minor Puppy, Special Minor Puppy, Puppy and Special Puppy Classes excepted, whether restricted or not).

**GRADUATE**: For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or four or more First Prizes at Championship Shows in Graduate, Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open classes, whether restricted or not where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

**POST GRADUATE**: For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or five or more First Prizes at Championship Shows in Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open classes, whether restricted or not where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed

**LIMIT**: For dogs which have not become show Champions under the Kennel Club Regulations or under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club or won 7 or more First Prizes in all at Championship Shows in Limit and Open Classes confined to the Breed, whether restricted or not at Shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed

**OPEN**: For all dogs of the breed s for which the class is provided and eligible for entry at the show.

**SPECIAL OPEN**: As Open but limited as per classification

**VETERAN**: For dogs of not less than seven years of age on the day of the show

**SPECIAL WORKING**: For Dogs which have been placed in a recognised H.P.R. Working test or gained any Field Trial award including Certificate of Merit, Diploma of Merit or a Show Gundog Working Certificate

**BRACE**: For Two Exhibits (either sex or mixed) of one breed belonging to the same exhibitor, each exhibit having been entered in some class other than Brace or Team

**IMPORTED REGISTER**: For Breeds confined to the Imported Breeds Register and only when an interim standard has been published by the Kennel Club, Such Breeds may be exhibited in this class only and are ineligible for any other competition whatsoever

**NOT FOR COMPETITION**: Societies may at their discretion, accept Not for Competition entries. Societies may accept such entries from breeds of dog not included within the title of the Society and at shows held over more than one day, such entries may be accepted from any breed on any day

## **Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition F (Annex B)**

1. These regulations must be observed when a dog is prepared for exhibition and/or exhibited at any Kennel Club Licensed event. Objections may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under these show regulations and/or for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rule A42.
  - a) A dog found to have been exhibited in breach of these regulation will automatically be disqualified from exhibition at the show and from any award gained there at
  - b) Unless the exhibitor provides a satisfactory explanation for the dog being exhibited in breach of these regulations then he/she may be subject to further penalties of either a fine or as listed under Rule A42
2.
  - a) No substance, which alters the natural colour, texture or body of the coat, may be present in the dog's coat for any purpose at any time during the show. No substance, which alters the natural colour of any external part of the dog, may be present on the dog for any purpose at any time during the show.
  - b) Any other substance (other than water) which may be used in the preparation of a dog for exhibition must not be allowed to remain in the coat or any other part of the dog at the time of exhibition
3. No act or operation which alters the natural confirmation of a dog or any part thereof may be performed except:
  - a) Operations certified to the satisfaction of the General Committee
  - b) The removal of dewclaws of any breed
  - c) Operations to prevent breeding provided that such operations are notified to the Kennel Club before neutered dogs are shown.Nor must anything be done calculated to in the opinion of the General Committee to deceive.
4. The General Committee without previous notice may order an examination of any dog or dogs at any show. Any examination thus ordered would be made by a person having executive authority who shall have a written directive from the Kennel Club in their possession. Samples may be taken for further examination and analysis.
5. Any individual has the right to lodge an objection to a dog only if he/she is the owner or handler of a dog competing in the same breed or class. An objection may, however, be lodged by an official of the show or by anyone so deputed by the Kennel Club. It will be the responsibility of the individual who lodges the objection or the official (as appropriate) to substantiate the grounds for the objection. The Kennel Club will substantiate the grounds for an objection made on its behalf.
6. Any objection by an individual related to an infringement of these Regulations must be made in writing to the Show Secretary at his/her office before the close of the show and the individual must produce evidence of identity at the time of lodging the complaint.
